A demonstration rain garden was built to protect water quality in the salmon-bearing Dungeness River at the Nature Center in Sequim, on land owned by the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe. A partnership was formed with the Tribe and the River Center to design, build and maintain the garden. A demonstration gravel infiltration trench at the Kitsap Conservation District offices in Poulsbo and bioinfiltration swales at Peninsula College in Port Angeles were highlighted with on-site signage and detailed information about the designs on the website.
